The Spanish selection you heard following the transmission of "Song in my Heart", was "Fueron tu Ojos", played by the "Agrupación Norteña". We regret that the name of the tenor soloist participating in this program was unavailable, as he was only a minor staff singer.

You will be interested to know that XEAN is owned by Cía. Radio-difusora Nacional, S.A., and is located at Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua, Mexico. Its official frequency is 750 Kcs. and its power 5,000 watts, with a wavelength of 400 mts.

Mr. James J. Hart, of Irvington, N. J., a member of WOR, of Newark, N. J., sent us a clipping from the Newark News re-printing our letter to you of April 3rd. We appreciate very much the service you have rendered us in having our letter published in the radio page of that paper.
