Dear Mr. Brauner:


This is to verify your DX Report of December 22, 1953, in which you read our signal while we were on the air for our regular Frequency Check which we make with the Phil Hedrick Measuring Service of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, each fourth Tuesday of the month. This check takes place from 4:10 to 4:20 A.M. and consists of a tone modulation and voice identification.

Your letter is about the fifth such DX Report we have received during the winter months from National Radio Club members in your approximate area. We are very happy to hear from you and only wish that our 250 Watts would permit such broad coverage around the clock, instead of only in the very early morning hours.

This station signs on the air each weekday morning at 5:30 and signs off at midnight. Our studios and transmitter are located in our own building on Bragg Boulevard; which leads to Ft. Bragg, the home of the 82nd Airborne Division, and Glenwood Drive inside the city limits of Fayetteville.

Once again, thanks for your report and we would appreciate hearing from you again.
