Our transmitter is a Gates 250-C1 with two 810's as P.P.R.F. amplifier and two 810's as modulators running around 1275 volts. We have been heard 50 miles north of New York City at 4:45 P.M. with KYW going full blast, How's that?

Thanks again for the f.b. reports and keep listening. We may have more power some day.
