This verifies your report of reception of KSJB from 1:46 to 2:02 AM CWT on December 8th, 1942.

Thank you very much for your very complete report. It is the first we have had from New York state since we changed to 600 kc. from 1400. We were formerly using call letters of KRMC but changed last June when we changed frequency.

I have had some reports from Ohio stating that we had deep fades there due to WCAO and perhaps that may in part account for you being unable to hear us until 1:30. Our fades should be deep and long as we maintain our frequency to a very small part of one cycle per second.
