
This is in reply to your letter of February 7, 1935 in reference to the reception of a test broadcast from Station W3XDD during the early morning of February 7th.

The signals which you received undoubtedly originated at Station W3XDD, Whippany, N. J., during an experimental transmitting test which was made between 1:11 and 4:05 A.M. E.S.T. on February 7th. The carrier frequency used for this test was 900 kilocycles. Your report coincides with the station log for this test period and you may consider this letter as your verification.

As a matter of general information, Station W3XDD is operated by the Bell Telephone Laboratories, Inc., for experimental purposes in connection with the development of commercial radio broadcast equipment. You probably already know that the radio equipment developed by the Bell Telephone Laboratories is manufactured and sold by the Western Electric Company and that many of the large broadcast stations in this country are equipped with radio apparatus supplied by this company.

We appreciate the information contained in your report regarding the characteristics of the test program as received by you and do not feel that we should accept postage for a reply. Accordingly, we are returning herewith the postage which you enclosed with your report.
