Dear Mr. Brauner :-

We are very glad to be able to verify your reception of our signals on the morning of Oct. 11th, while we were carrying on a test program at the request of the Supervisor of Radio, in order that the frequency of our station might be checked.

The call letters of Station WEAI were changed to WESG, effective Oct. 1st of this year, and other call letters were assigned at the same time to the station in Glens Falls which originally had this call.

We are now operating on a continuous program from 8:30 in the morning until local sunset, which at this time of the year is 5:30, and should you have the opportunity of listening to us on Saturday we would much appreciate a line from you as to the strength of our signals. We have no Sunday schedule at present.

WLCI was forced to relinquish its license last Spring, when it was unable to satisfy the technical requirements of the Federal Radio Commission.
