Dear Radio Friend:

We have your report of Dec. 1st saying that you picked up our signals between 1:30 and 1:50 am. We are pleased to confirm your report, since your report checks with our station log. We were running a special midnight program and were very anxious to hear from our distant listeners.

This station is only operating on 100 watts power by authority of THE FEDERAL RADIO COMMISSION, unlimited hours. At the present time, we are on the air every day except Sundays from 12:30-4:30 and 6:00-12:00midnight, and on Sundays from 10:30-11:30 am and 1:00-11:00pm.

We are very sorry to advise that we do not issue the EKKO stamps you asked for, so we are using one of the stamps you sent for the postage on this letter and are returning the other four.

May we say, that there are very few broadcasting stations who will answer a report on their signals with a personal letter, except those of several thousand miles. Therefore, perhaps you will accept this letter of acknowledgement in place of the regular EKKO stamp.
