Thanks for your letter of December 10th. Your report is appreciated and I am glad to verify it.

Our transmitter and studios are together, one half mile east of Bellefontaine on the highest point in Ohio, 1550' above sea level.

We use a W. E. 23-C console, a Gates Limiting Amp. (SA-39A), Gates Modulation Monitor (MO-2639), Gates Frequency Monitor (MO-2890) and a Gates BC-500 D Transmitter, operating on 1390 kc, 500 W - day, feeding a 200' Stainless guyed tower with 21-125 coax. Efficiency 75%.

Bellefontaine, Ohio is the county seat of Logan, which was laid out in the spring of 1820 and so named because of it's many "beautiful springs". It's water now supplied by ten Artesian wells.

Bellefontaine is located at the Highest Point in Ohio (1550'). There are 15 small factories and a number of small shops as well as the RR. shops and yards. Population of city proper, 10, 000.

We hope to open for commercial business about December 18th.

We are happy to be added to your D. X. records and wish you the best of D. X.ing.
