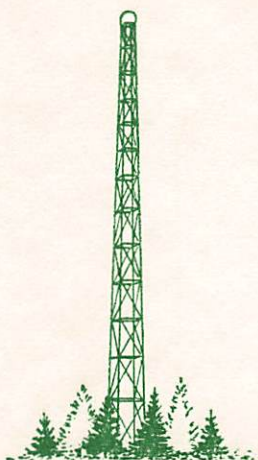

Dear Mr. Brauner:

Thank you for your letter and reception report. We did make a special broadcast for the DX chasers on 27 January 1964 between 3:15 AM and 3:50 AM EST. DXing is a fine hobby. You definitely did hear us 1 February 1964 around noon time. The following are a few points of interest concerning our station:

- Location:** Loretto, Pennsylvania, Cambria county, about 17 miles north of Altoona, about 23 miles east of Johnstown in western Pennsylvania. Located on campus of St. Francis College, a liberal arts, coeducational college of about 1200 full-time students.
- Antenna:** A 187-foot self-supporting non-directional illuminated steel tower on campus.
- Transmitter:** RCA model BTA-250L, 250 watts into the antenna. Located adjacent to tower on campus, remotely operated from studio.
- Studio:** RCA and Gates equipment on campus, two studios and one newsroom. This is a commercial station owned and operated by the College.
- Network:** None- UPI wire news service, and teletype service to WJAC-AM, FM, TV, and Johnstown Tribune-Democrat newspaper.
- Frequency:** 1400 kilocycles, licensed for unlimited operation, present operating hours-6:55 AM to 10:00 PM EST Monday thru Saturday. No Sunday broadcasting yet. This is why you could not hear us during those two Sundays you tried to tune us in on your set. Initial broadcast for our station was at noon on 7 October 1963.

Frequency Measurement: Performed during normal broadcasting day.

We received 29 reports to date from listeners who heard our special broadcast of 27 January 1964. These were ones who were able to give definite identified program items.


