Thank you for your nice letter of December 11, 1947. Your report compares favorably with our log of the frequency check for that morning.

We are using Raytheon equipment throughout with the exception of a Doolittle frequency monitor. We have a 265 foot guyed Wincharger tower fed by a six wire transmission line.

We are a bit crowded at present as our temporary studios are located at the transmitter.

As you know we are located in the mountains of east Tennessee and have changeable weather here. It gets cold here but generally after the holidays and we have more severe weather than surrounding towns because we are higher up in the mountains.
