This is to acknowledge receipt of your card showing that you received this station on night of Dec., 23rd., (Sunday) at 11-52 C.S.T. or 12-52 E.S.T.

We are glad to hear from you and to verify this reception and believe you will be interested to know the conditions under which we were operating at the time you received us.

We are broadcasting nightly from a night club, "Crystal Gardens" by remote control, over a five and one quarter mile telephone line before the music goes on the air at our transmitter, that is located on an eleven story building up town. We were using only fifty watts of our licensed power at the time you received us, this speaks well for both our transmitter and your receiver.

Note that you are using a 1926 model Popular Radio Super-Het, there is nothing better than the Super when she is Hetting properly and the writer speaks from experience, having built several supers and also was principal builder of this station.

We are on the air every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9 to 10 P. M. C.S.T., with a "shoppers Hour" and every night at 11 to 12 P. M. C.S.T. with dance music from Crystal Gardens, let us hear from you again when you receive us, will have on full 100 watts power just as soon as an order of new transmitting tubes arrive.
