Dear Mr. Brauner,

It was indeed a pleasure to receive your nice letter concerning the test transmission that I held on the 18th of February 1950.

Before I forget it let me say that your log of activities was absolutely correct and we are happy to send you a verification of the reception.

I appreciated the extent of your report which even included conditions existing in the month of February.

The equipment used here is Collins throughout and the antenna is a 267 foot guyed steel tower. The majority of our programs originate from our downtown studio except from ~~the~~ until three PM each week day and also from one until six PM on Sunday the programs originate from our transmitter.

Hamilton is a very small town with a population of about 5000 and is sustained chiefly by agriculture and the raising of livestock. The town is about 50 miles from the center of the Lone Star State.

Yours truly who has been in Texas since 1942, hails from Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

I believe that covers about everything of importance here at this time so will close now and hope to hear from you in the near future.
