Dear Mr. Brauner:

In reply of your letter of Sept. 18, 1945 this to indicate your DX report was absolutely correct and that the new call letters of our station is KCRS. The station is under the same management and is the same in every respect other than the call letter change from KRLH to KCRS.

You mention listening monthly for our signal----you will probably not hear it as we make frequency checks only four times a year. As you probably know the commission at this time does not require checks at all of this nature as long as the stations approved frequency standard is in operating condition and in which case ours is. We check four times a year with Kansas City to be sure our frequency standard is OK.

OK on your giving up ham radio several years ago due to home conditions. I am having home troubles too----before the war was over the gossips' thought all the radio equipment I had must be sending messages to the Germans or something, ha. My antenna is now down at home, guess I will hook on to the ~~close~~ line or maybe bring it out at the KCRS tower and see how it will cook on this 438 footer.
