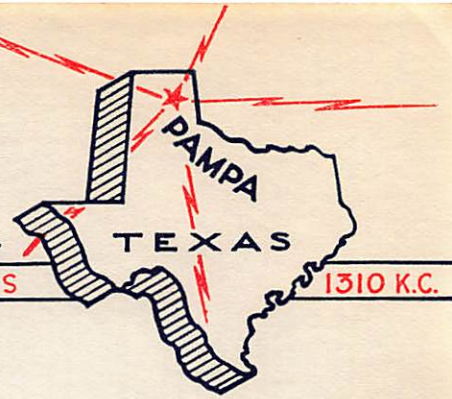

Referring to your suggesting about a change of time on our schedules, we had to get the present one okayed by the FCC due to the fact that a near-by station, KFYO in Lubbock, operating on unlimited time, is also on 1310 kc. Since this would further involve us to some extent, we are inclined to leave well enough alone, even though we regret to learn about the station in Royal Oak.
