
Thank you for your detailed report on our signals from the vicinity of Buffalo, N.Y.

The station was on for frequency check with RCA Labs. at Riverhead, N.Y. Signal was 4 cycles high in frequency at start of check, and zero, or 690.000 at finish of check. Your observations check with our log in every particular.

WNNT is a 250 watt daytime station, using Gates equipment throughout. Pair of 210's in final feeding a 280 foot vertical radiator through pressurized co-ax.

Frequency checks are run monthly. In the future, modulation will be checked at the same time, and one or two musical transcriptions will be played.
