In reply to your letter asking for verification of received signal on Oct. 28, 1950. According to mylog, at that time I was transmitting for a frequency check. But the sad part of it is that I didn't have an audio generator to put a tone on the carrier. Next time I expect to have the proper facilities. Also there was a slight mistake in the interpretation of the contract with the monitoring station as to what day the frequency check was to be. Here is the proper schedule. The second and the fourth Friday mornings of each month, between the hours of 12:30 and 12:45 AM, PST. For some reason I thought it was Saturday morning. From now on you will hear us at the above time.

Thanks for the signal report. I'm never endingly surprised at the reports I get here. I've had reports from some of the most remote places. Penna., New Jersey, Mass. and several others. The station operates on 1150 kc with a power of 1000 watts. It is a Gates Model BC-1F transmitter. All audio equipment is Gates.

I'm a native New Yorker and I'm always glad to hear from anyone in that part of the country. The last time I was in New York was in 1947 when I was in the service.

Thanks again for the report and the letter. Glad to hear from you any time.
