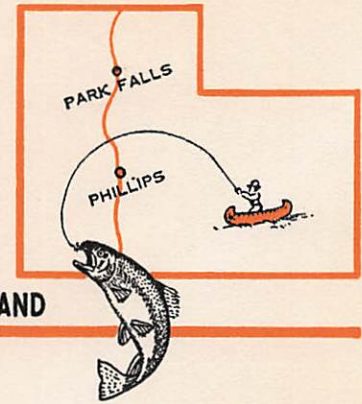

Dear Mr. Brauner:

Thank you for your letter of March 17, 1954 describing reception of WFPF on that date. Your report is sufficiently accurate and, therefore, this letter will serve as a verification.

Radio Station WFPF is on the air the third Wednesday morning of each month from 1:30 to 2:00 A.M., CST with a frequency check with the Phelps Laboratory. Our regular broadcasting schedule is from 7:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. and on Sunday, 8:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. We have been on the air since July 1953 with 100 watts power and have increased power to 250 watts on March 11th of this year. Our equipment is made up of an RCA transmitter and limiting amplifier, modulation monitor, Gates frequency monitor and console and Rek-O-Kut turn tables and various microphones. Our tower is 150 feet in height, situated in a swamp and our studios, offices, and transmitter are located in the same building situated just inside the city limits of Park Falls.

The M & N Broadcasting Co. Inc. owns and operates WFPF as well as WIGM in Medford and WLDY at Ladysmith, Wisconsin.
