Mr. Karchevski:

Thank you very much for your fine letter of 26 April.

We sign on every morning at 5:45 a.m. with the latest national and international news at 6:00 a.m. Our initial sign-on power is only 250 watts. We increase power with official sunrise, which for April was 6:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. For May we increase at 5:15 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and for June from 5:00 a.m. until 8:30 p.m.

We use a Gates BC-IT transmitter with a uniform cross section, guyed, series excited vertical radiator antenna. The tower is 137' with an overall height of 140'. The Ground system consists of 120 buried copper wire radials 195' in length.

We operate on a frequency of 1240 kilocycles with a power of 250 watts Non-Directional antenna night-time and 1,000 watts Non-Directional daytime with unlimited hours of operation.
