Dear Sir:

First of all, let me apologize for the long delay in replying to your letter dated February 27, 1972. Shortly after receiving your letter, I was taken by a series of illnesses which has finally left me well enough to answer your request.

There are only two minor discrepancies with your log report and mine at the station. These, however, should not be construed to jeopardize verification of your reception report in my opinion, in view of the large weight of evidence in your favor.

#1 - My log shows no 2:28 I.D. This could be due to lack of logging on my part.

#2 - My log and memory recall shutting down the transmitter immediately after the 2:31 conclusion of test announcement.

KFKF is presently owned and operated by Bellevue Broadcasters, Inc., operating at 1,000 watts, as you heard on the test message. We normally sign off at midnight, but certain transmitter troubles required that tube changing and testing be conducted during the "experimental period". Since there is no "dummy" antenna, and the transmitter had to be operated for a half-hour, or more, it was necessary to use the regular broadcast antenna system.
