Dear D-X Friend:

The D-X program broadcast from WRBL January 10th, 1932 was a wonderful success. More than three hundred letters were received from this one broadcast and most everyone reported the reception clear and with plenty of volume.

This illustrated folder is to better acquaint you with our station and also show the states, cities and persons from whom correct reports have been received from all our D-X broadcasts. In the United States we have heard from 34 states, 331 cities and 596 persons. Canada adds Ontario with 16 cities and 32 persons.

Our next D-X broadcast is to be JANUARY 31st, 1932 FROM 2 to 4 A. M. CENTRAL STANDARD TIME. This program is especially for you and your friends.

When you receive this letter will you call ten friends and invite them to tune in and report on this special program. This will greatly increase our D-X family. We also want a complete report from you on this broadcast. All correct reports of reception will be verified. We do not have EKKO stamps but will get them if you say so; what about it? A souvenir booklet of WRBL and Columbus, Georgia is being prepared and will be sent to you and everyone that is added to our D-X Honor Roll.

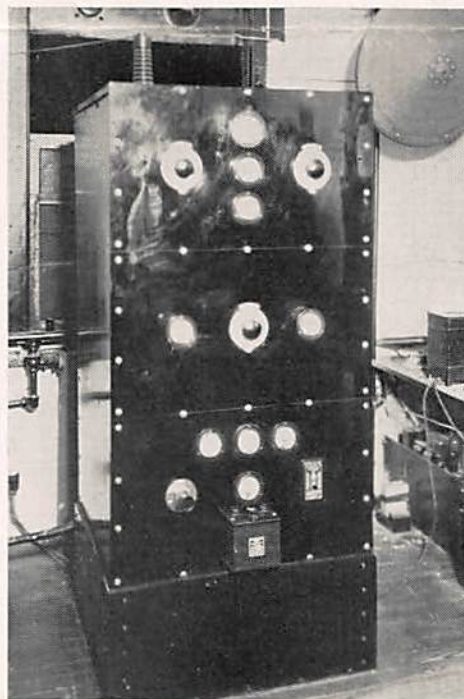
