In reply to your communication of January 18th wish to advise that changes have been made both in call letters and in the location of the transmitter.

Having acquired the licenses of W R N Y - W P A P - W Q A O in addition to our original license W H N, we have consolidated all of these stations on full time operation eliminating all call letters with the exception of W H N.

The new transmitter is located in Astoria, Long Island, utilizing one of the new type vertical radiators and our coverage from this new site has been increased considerably.

We are still in a state of consolidation and reorganization and have no organ programs at the present time. However, in the near future you may expect programs of this nature.
