Dear Rolland,

Thank you very much for your reception report on our recent test transmission.

I am pleased to verify your reception of WKXO, 1500 kHz., 250 Watts ND from 12:05 to 12:38 a.m. E.S.T. on Monday morning, February 14, 1977 during our equipment check and DX test.

WKXO uses a 143 foot non-directional antenna and a Gates BC-250GY transmitter. Berea is in east-central Kentucky in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains, elevation 1,150 feet. The nominal daytime range of WKXO is 75 miles.

We were especially interested in how different types of programming would fare against major interference such as KSTP, WDEE, and XERH, so your report and those from Neil Zank and Skip Dabelstein are especially useful. So far, we've had reports from Mass., R.I., Conn., N.J., N.Y., Pa., Del., Md., D.C., Va., N.C., Fla., Ont., Ohio, Mich., Ind., Ala., Wisc., Ill., Mo., Neb., and Kans.!

Once again, many thanks for your report.
