Dear Rolland,

Yes, I am happy to confirm your reception report of our signal on January 11th, 1975 2:05 AM to 2:20 AM CST. We were on the air all night broadcasting emergency messages to residents of our area who were snowbound. The storm dumped more than 15 inches of snow and closed our roads for two days. It may have been the worst storm to hit our area this century. We were operating at full power (1000 watts) instead of our normal 250 watts we are allowed at night. As you may know, the F.C.C. allows this kind of operation during emergencies. Our antenna is a single tower 158 feet in height, which is slightly less than a quarter wavelength. This gives a fairly high angle of radiation, which accounts for the fact that our signal came in so well where you live. However, I am surprised that the signal was interference free.

Thanks for the reception report and good luck with your DXing.
