THIS IS TO VERIFY YOUR RECEPTION OF WDXN DURING OUR ANNUAL PROOF OF PERFORMANCE TEST ON THE MORNING OF SUNDAY, JANUARY 25, 1976, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 0005 AND 0215 A.M. CST.

WDXN operates on 540 Khz with a non-directional daytime power of 1000 watts. The WDXN transmitter is a Gates Type No. BC-1T.

The WDXN tower is 368 feet high with a ground system of 120 buried copper radials each 455' in length equally spaced about the tower base. The tower is located
