"Gone but not near forgot we still got our mind on yeah my man."
- 5:25 Public service message--To vote in the County you must be registered at the Court House and if you live in the City you must be registered at the Court House and City Hall. Make sure you are a registered voter its so important--Promo for the Masonite Employees Credit Union.
- 5:26 PM Lost the signal.

It was a pleasure to hear your station on a good sporadic E Skip opening that also brought me stations in Alabama and Florida. You were heard in stereo, fluttering at first then solid until abruptly lost to KLYF Des Moines, Ia. at 5:26 PM. My reception equipment consists of a Heathkit AR 1302 AM & FM stereo receiver and FM rabbit ears for an antenna. Thaks for an excellent logging.

I would be pleased to hear from you in reply to this report, and to receive a letter of verification, stating the time and date of my reception. For your reply return postage is enclosed. If you have a coverage map that you can spare it would be greatly appreciated. I hope that this report has been of interest to you.
