It is indeed my pleasure to confirm your reception report of WNHV-FM on July 4, 1977 from 1733 to 1745 EDST. A seperate confirmation sheet is enclosed, along with descriptive literature.

WNHV-FM operates with an Effective Radiated Power of 3,000 watts. Our antenna is mounted 245 feet above average terrain on Crafts Hill in West Lebanon, New Hampshire. We also operate Studio-Transmitter link WBK-221 between the transmitter site and our main studio location on North Hartland Road in White River Junction.

WNHV-AM operates as a daytime station on the regional frequency of 910kHz. Our AM transmitter is a Gates BC-1T. The FM transmitter is a CCA FM-3000D using a Wilkinson FME-10 exciter and a Moseley LPE-10 as an auxilary exciter.

By the way, for several years I held a ham license (WA1ISH) and was an avid SWL in my high-school days.
