Rec'd your second letter in regard to hearing our station. The vy much for the report. We are sorry that we didn't acknowledge it sooner.

I have chkd our xmtr log and find that we were on the air at that time with a freq chk with Pt. Reyes, Cal.

We run a KW here daytime and 500 Watta at night. Our xmtr is an RCA job with a pair of 833A's in the final and a pairm of 833A's as modulators. All our speech eqp and other EXECC associated eqp is also RCA. This station went on the air in the winter of 1952. Our antenna sets right on the beach. That is, in salt water of course.

So far we have had some excellent reports from around the country and we approt them vy much.

I am a part time employee of this company. And am assuming the position of Ch Engineer until another one is employed. I work for the Alaska Communications System as an Electronics Technician. This System is part of the Army Signal Corp here in Alaska. I am not a GI but a civilian employee.
