I am pleased to report reception of your station heard on February 24, 1945
from 6:30 A.M. to M. Eastern War Time on 1270 kilocycles
Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

6:30 A.M., EWT "WPDC, Jacksonville, Florida operating
on 1270 Kcs. by authority of FCC.
Roy Johnson speaking on behalf of
WPDC wishes you all good morning.
Start with our National Anthem."
"Star Spangled Banner"

WPDC, Fort Worth, Texas signed on.
WPDC's signals could be heard for the
entire playing of the National Anthem,
but the announcement that followed and
the remainder of the program was lost
in distortion behind KFJZ.

Hope that there may be sufficient data above to warrant
a verification of WPDC. Your signals were time until
KFJZ down in Fort Worth came on and drowned your signals
out. Sorry to give you such a short report, but I have
never heard WPDC before, tho I have tried for over a year.
When do you hold your test broadcasts, if any?
