Dear Norman,

Thank you very much for your reception report of May 2. We appreciate all reports on reception and it is good to know we are being received at Mt. Waverley. As you may know we are an all volunteer, community radio station relying on peoples' enthusiasm to keep it going. The studios, transmitter and mast were all built by volunteers, many of whom had never been involved in radio before.

Some technical details:

Transmitter: amateur designed and built. plate and screen modulated. 250 watts output, capable of 1000 watts output.

We are restricted to such a low power by the terms of our licence.

Antenna: 135' base-loaded vertical with 12' diameter capacity hat. 65 radials buried 12" each 100' long.

Landline from studio to transmitter.

I hope this information is of interest. Feel free to drop in at any time.
