This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated January 20, 1954. Your letter of January 25 arrived prior to this and has been answered already.

Herewith enclosed, you will please find four verification cards confirming your reports.

True, most of our signals on medium waves are not heard very well in foreign countries, but at the present time, comparatively a few listeners are tuned in to radio networks for our domestic service. There are about five such listeners in the United States and a few more in New Zealand. It seems that our medium-wave beams are not audible elsewhere, and no attempt is being made to strengthen them for the time being.

As I stated in my last letter, Station Sendai is oprating on 1090 kc/s (JOHB). The remaining three reports correspond with our logs.
