Dear Mr. Maguire,

We thank you for your interesting and detailed report on our transmission of November 14th, 1951. This report was accurate in every detail although in converting to local time, your calculations were exactly two hours in error. We enclose D.X. card which will serve as verification and also to convey our sincere thanks.

We would also like to clarify the position regarding Commercial Broadcasting in this country. In this respect New Zealand is served by a network of National (non-commercial) Stations situated in the main centres, and a further network of Commercial Stations which cover the same areas. These are complimented by a group of smaller units, of which 2YC is included, embracing aspects of both the National and Commercial Divisions and operating from smaller towns and country districts.
