Deair DXer:

Thank you for your report on the reception of WLBH, 1170 Kilocycles 250 Watts during our equipment test broadcasts.

We were on the air from November 16th through November 24th, 1:00 to 4:00 AM CST and your report of receiving our station on November 16, 1946 checks with our program log. We are a daytime station and now operate daytime only

We are using a quarter-wave vertical antenna with a grounding system of 90 radials extending 215 feet from the base of the tower. We have a 250 watt Raytheon Transmitter and it is coupled to the tower through a low pass "T" matching metwork.

We received more than 300 DX reports and the cash prize of \$10.00 goes to Ted Saling of Estacada, Oregon, for receiving us the greatest distance.

We have delayed sending out these verifications to make sure that all DX letters were in.
