Dear Sir:

Received your letter several days ago and was very pleased to hear from you. Thanks a million for your interest in our new station.

We are using Collins Equipment - 300 G transmitter with 6L6 buffer; 807 IP amplifier, driving a pair of paralleled 810's in the final. We are feeding 235 feet of transmission line, terminating in a Collins tuning unit and radiating with a 150 foot guyed Blaw-Knox tower. Our ground system consists of 120 radials spaced 3 degrees apart, 175 feet long and covered by 48 square feet of copper mesh wire-all bonded together.

Your excellent report is in accordance with our station log. Thanks again for your response to our frequency check, which is scheduled on the third Monday of the month from 3:50 A.M. to 4:00 A.M. E.S.T., and you are invited to tune us in on Monday, October 15th, at that time.
