Received your nice letter and report on reception of our station on November 21st. We are glad to verify your reception and would have answered sooner but I have been waiting in vain for the pictures that our announcer, Mike Davis, promised. Just as soon as we get some I will be sure to forward you one. I am keeping all reports on file.

The station here is a Gates 250 Watt job with a 160 Ft. Windcharger tower. We are located about 2,000 Ft. above sea-level in a rocky and hilly country. Our normal daytime range is about 50 miles, but at night the interference on this channel cuts us down to about 25 miles.

If you are ever down this way look us up and we will be glad to show you through the station and transmitter.
