Dear Carl:

This letter confirms your reception of KNBR at the time 2:55 to 3:10AM, Pacific Standard Time, November 24, 1992.

KNBR is one of the original 50 kW clear-channel stations in the United States and was the flagship station for the NBC West Coast Network. The station's first call letters were KPO. It became KNBC for a short time after the war until NBC moved the call to Los Angeles for their TV station. In 1935 NBC built our transmitter site to increase the stations's power to 50 kW. This site is still in use today, although the antenna and transmitters have changed several times since that time.

KNBR uses a Franklin transmit antenna which has approximately 3 dB gain over a standard 1/4 wave vertical radiator. Our transmitters are Harris MW-50C and MW-50A. KNBR operates at 50 kW non-directional 24 hours a day.
