Thank you for your reception report of reception on March 7, 2000 from Omaha, Nebraska. It has been confirmed.

WTAM, known to listeners as AM 1100, operates 24 hours daily on 110 kHz. We broadcast a format of news, talk, and sports programs, and are one of approximately 25 class 1-A clear-channel audio stations in the United States, broadcasting with a 50,000-watt non-directional signal. We are known as the station that is heard in at least 38 states and half of Canada.

WTAM has been on the air since 1923, although between 1972 and 1979 it was known by a series of different call signs, including WKYC, KYW and WWE. We are owned by Clear Channel Communications.

AM 1100 is an affiliate of the ABC Radio Network. We are also the home of Cleveland Indians Baseball, The Cleveland Browns, and Cleveland Cavaliers.

We thank you again for writing, and hope you will have the chance to tune in AM 1100 again in the future.
