Dear Radio Copan Listener:

Let me take this opportunity to personally thank you for your recent correspondence sent to Radio Copan. We very much appreciate your letting us know what reception is like in your area, and your honest comments and suggestions regarding our programming.

Radio Copan is still less than a year old, and we are still only beginning to develop the station's potential. During the past year we have managed to increase the power to provide a more viable signal to our primary target areas of the Caribbean and North America. Much to our surprise and pleasure, we have also found that we are now being heard regularly by listeners in Europe, Latin America, Oceania and other parts of the world.

Radio Copan is a different kind of shortwave station. First of all, it is privately-owned -- a joint venture between Radio Stereo Amistad in Tegucigalpa and Radio Miami International in Miami. Secondly, it is commercial in nature, selling airtime to anyone, anywhere who wants to reach an international radio audience. And we sell the airtime at an extremely low price: one dollar (U.S.) per minute, with substantial discounts for longer block programs. If you or anyone you know might be interested in buying airtime on Radio Copan, please contact me, and I can give you detailed information about prices, time availabilities, etc.

We do produce our own programming as well, which consists of Latin American music and short features in English and Spanish about Honduras, Central America and the Mayan culture. In fact, Radio Copan's name comes from the ancient Mayan city of Copan in present-day Honduras. (Those of you who send us reception reports will receive a Radio Copan QSL card with a color photo of the Copan ruins.) We know that one of our most popular programs is the new "Viva Copan!," in which we tell a bit about Honduras and we read letters from listeners like yourself from around the world. "Viva Copan!" is now on the air seven days per week.

In the coming months, we plan to expand our transmission schedule and to add many more programs in both English and Spanish, and perhaps other languages as well. We hope you'll stay tuned and let us know what you think. You can contact us by standard mail, telephone, fax or e-mail.

I regret that due to the volume of correspondence we receive, I cannot personally reply in writing to each letter, fax or e-mail message. That's why I'm sending you this form letter. But rest assured that I personally read each and every letter, fax and message we receive, and I reply to each one personally on the Radio Copan Mailbag.

I very much appreciate your kind comments, your frank suggestions and the information you send about yourself, your family and the place where you live. The post cards and other souvenirs that you send us go up on the walls of our office, for all of our visitors to see. And if you are ever visiting Miami, feel free to stop by and say hello. Some of you, I have met personally over the years. Others I only know through correspondence. But through the magic of shortwave, we have created a large family of listeners and friends in all parts of the world. Thanks for being part of that family.

RADIO COPAN PROGRAM SCHEDULE

Effective June 13, 1994. Subject to change.

Radio Copan International transmits seven days per week from 1900-0200 UTC on 15,675 kHz in the 19 meter band. In addition to Latin American music and short features in English and Spanish about Honduras, Central America and the Mayan civilization, Radio Copan broadcasts a number of longer feature programs, including:

ENGLISH

VIVA COPAN! - Fifteen minutes of news from Honduras, the environment and ecology, the history of Honduras, Central American business news, travel features, DX information, letters from listeners and Latin American music. Seven days per week at 2000 and 0145 UTC. Also Monday-Saturday at 2200 and Sunday at 2130 UTC.

A TEXAS SHOOTOUT - Texans Mark and Steve debate the virtues of Democratic and Republic politics in the United States on the first Monday and the first Saturday of each month at 2215-2230 UTC.

CHRIST AT THE DOOR - A weekly 15-minute religious message on Sundays at 2215 UTC.

RADIO WAVES - A DX program hosted by David Williams of the Global DX Club, especially for shortwave aficionados. On the second and fourth Saturday of each month at 2215-2230 UTC.

THE FINAL CRISIS - A weekly half-hour religious program hosted by Orlando Stuart, Sundays at 2100 UTC.

THESE LAST DAYS - A weekly religious program on Sundays at 2145-2215 UTC.
