The success achieved by RADIO RSA is shown in numerous international awards bestowed upon the individual language services and in the more than 100 000 letters received from listeners each year.



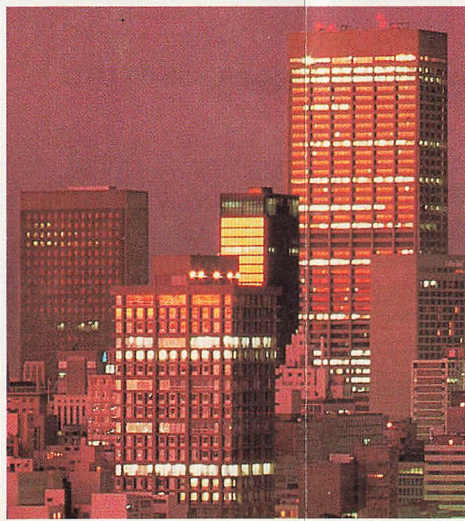
