

Sherry Lynn first became known in the United States and then in the Soviet Union for the song she wrote titled "We Can Walk in Peace". This song won the Aaron Copland International Composers Contest Award in 1984 and a year later it was heard in the Soviet Union. Sherry's call for peace was warmly received by the Soviet people.
