Dear Mr. Morss,

This will acknowledge your report of reception of WTUX on the occasion of its test of November 19 with S5 signals on your SX42. This report comes very welcome since we received many fair reports from your area, and we had no idea that we covered so far North.

Your log is quite satisfactory. Many were quite detailed, some telling almost every word that was said. Many had peculiar errors, such as calling Dorothy Shay Dorothy Kay, Fay, Audrey Kay, and even Kitty Carr. (I wonder who was kidding who?) However, most of them were similar to yours, and were sufficient to identify our transmission. We received letters from Seattle, and Newfoundland, among the best DX heard. Severl from the farthest listeners were merely casual reports, occasioned by my request for mail.

I hope that you will excuse the extreme lateness of this report. In the course of transporting letters from the station to my home, some slipped under the seat, unnoticed. I found them only now, after moving half way across the country. I am now the chief engineer of the above station, and will be glad to cooperate in any tests you may want to have. As a matter of interest, I will be on on the 10th of January for a frequency test at 2:30 am MST for about one half hour, half of which will be devoted to a DX test for some personal friends. However, I would welcome other correspondence, of course.

It seems that WWPB caused most of the New England boy trouble. None from the south reported any trouble from the source. None heard KONP. Your letters have been appreciated by the staff of WTUX and looked upon with some amazement. We wish to thank you, as well as the NRC for your cooperation in this test.

From a purely personal standpoint, I am sorry this delay has been caused. I assure you that any further correspondence to this station will receive my immediate personal attention. Thank your for your trouble.
