The transmitter at K G I W is a Gates 250-A feeding a series excited 150 foot double tapered guyed tower. Alamosa is in the San Luis valley of southern Colorado, at an altitude of 7546 feet. The peaks of some of the mountains that surround this huge valley are over 14,000 feet. It is said that ours is the highest standard broadcast station in the country.
