
Dear Sir,

Thank you for your letter post dated 4th December 1956 and also for the enclosed international reply coupon.

The Light Programme of the BBC is broadcast on 1214 kc/s by 10 stations in this country, the most powerful being Brookmans Park, Moorside Edge and Westerglen. At times, our domestic services propagate over very long distances and we have had numerous reports on reception of our Light Programme in North America, though these were mainly associated with periods of low solar activity. We are, at the present, approaching sunspot maximum, and the bulk of the reports which are now received on our domestic services relate to our London Television Service on 41.5 Mc/s (sound).

We are also enclosing a complimentary copy of our Overseas Journal LONDON CALLING, which gives full programme details together with a list of frequencies currently in use to serve different parts of the world (page 18).
