Thank you for your letter post-dated 24th December and for the enclosed International Reply Coupon.

The Scottish Home Service of the BBC is radiated on 809 kc/s by stations at Burghead, Westerglen, Redmoss and Dumfries. At 0800 GMT the Home Service carries 'The News', followed by 'Programme Parade' at 0810 GMT and then a programme of light music between 0820-0900 GMT. It was therefore, most likely the Scottish Home Service which you heard on the morning of 24th December.

In winter months during periods of low solar activity, conditions are favourable for the long distance propagation of medium waves over darkness paths, and you may be interested to know that during the past two or three winters we have received several reports of such reception from places as far away as India and New Zealand.
