Dear Sir,

Thank you for your letter of January 6th and for the enclosed International Reply Coupon.

The London Home Service of the BBC is radiated on 330 metres (908 kc/s) by Brookmans Park, which is situated about 10-15 miles north of London, and we think that it was most likely this station which you heard on the morning of January 6th. The overall times of the Home Service are 0630-2300 GMT.

During periods of low solar activity, and more particularly in winter months, conditions are favourable for the long distance propagation of medium waves over darkness paths and you may be interested to know that, during the past two or three winters, we have received reports of reception of our medium wave transmissions from places as far away as South America, India and New Zealand.

In accordance with your request, we have pleasure in enclosing a copy of 'The Copenhagen Wavelength Plan', which gives the allocation of long and medium wave channels to European broadcasting stations as agreed internationally in 1950. A summary of the wavelengths of BBC stations is given towards the end of the booklet.

Thank you once again for your report.
