Dear Mr. Morss:

Many thanks for your letter of November 25 reporting reception of XEOR in Bradford, Massachusetts.

The XEOR transmitter plant is located about 3 miles south of Reynosa on the Monterrey highway. As you may know, Reynosa is right on the Rio Grande opposite McAllen, Texas, about 60 miles upriver from Matamoros and Brownsville. Our antenna is a single guyed vertical tower 180' high tuned to a quarter wave. Our transmitter is a standard Gates 1 kw.

XEOR's broadcast schedule is from 5 AM to 12 midnight Mondays through Saturdays and 6 AM to 10 PM Sundays. All our broadcasting is in Spanish except of course for the English language station identification which you reported. We do not make any regularly scheduled frequency checks because we have our own frequency measuring device here and do not have to depend on outside measurements. The Mexican government calls for a frequency check about twice a year but on no set schedule.

You might also be interested to know that reception was also reported on the same morning by two other DXers; one in Iowa City, Iowa and another in Manhattan Beach, California.

Thanks again. We're always glad to have reports from DXers.
