KTSW operates on a frequency of 1400 Kilocycles, with a power of 250 watts. Transmitter - Collins 300F. Antenna Lingo tubular steel, guyed - 180 ft. high.

KTSW transmitter located south edge city limits, on the Cotton-wood River bottom. Elevation 1100 ft, above sea level.

KTSW studios located on the first floor of the Broadview Hotel, corner 6th and Merchant Street, on U. S. Hi-Way 50 South.

KTSW studio equipment - Collins 12H console, Western Electric Microphones, Western Electric 9-A reproducers.

KTSW regular schedule of Broadcast.
