First, let me say I hope that is the correct spelling of your name, and second, let me congratulate you for being able to get our station at the time you stated.

Normally, we are a daytime operation station. Sunrise to sunset. But on this particular night, or rather I should say morning, we were on during the experimental period of midnight to local sunrise conducting periodic maintenance tests on our transmitter equipment.

Secondly, we operate on the same frequency of 1570 kc as KERF as you noted, and them being 250,000 watts, sorts of slows us down because our maximum power is 250 watts. That's right, just 250 watts. However we have been fortunate enough to receive many letters throughout the country from people such as yourself that have picked up our station, and we are ever indebted to their resourcefulness and mechanic know how.
