Thank you for your reception report dated 9 August, 1982. Unfortunately, we do not have a QSL card to send you, so I hope this letter will suffice as confirmation of your report.

WHUE-AM operates from Lexington, MA with a two-pattern directional system. Our power to the directional system (3 towers) is 5KW both day and night. We utilize an RCA BTA5-L2 Ampliphase transmitter with an Orban Optimod processor. Our programming is carried by microwave link to the Lexington facility from our main studios located on floor #42 of the John Hancock Tower in Boston. Our FM facility is also located in Lexington, and the programming on both the AM and FM is fairly identical. We simulcast for part of the day on AM, and also operate in live and computer-automated format for the remainder of a 24-hour period.

I am pleased that you appreciated WHUE AM and hope you will continue listening. If you have any specific questions concerning our operation, I welcome your letter or phone call. Additionally, you are welcome to visit our studios during business hours, Monday through Friday. Call ahead and I'll give you the grand tour.
