Dear Mr. Morss:

I am pleased to confirm your reception of the emissions of WLYN on 1360 kilohertz for the period 0634 to 0658 EST on January 1, 1980.

The change in call letters from WNSR and WLYN to WLYN and WLYN-FM respectively became effective December 31, 1979. I agree with your comment that a change from separate calls back to a single call is a bit unusual these days; however the management decided that the call WNSR (for North Shore Radio) did not catch on too well with the listening audience. This is understandable when you consider the number of years that these stations have served the public as WLYN and WLYN-FM.

In answer to your question, I replaced Mr. Levy as Chief Engineer in November of 1978, since Mr. Levy was taking a position maintaining the electronic equipment used at Graham Junior College. I do not know where Mr. Levy went when Graham Junior College folded.
