Dear Mr. Morss:

Thank you for your report of reception of our broad-cast just before sign-off last Monday morning.

This letter is to verify your report as correct. We appreciate your interest in our station. We are a twenty-four (24) hour station; one thousand (1000) watts at present directional, north at night, non-directional daytime. We take our frequency-check on thefirst Monday of every month at 5:00 A.M.

E.S.T. having our weekly maintainence period from two (2) to six (6) A.M. on Mondays.

The unidentified two-toned signal you mentioned as interference was also reported by Mr. S.A. Rosenbaum of Wheeling, West Virginia, who DX'ed us during our frequency-check that same morning. He said he had been listening to it but our signal smothered it when we went on.
